RE: RELOCATION OF DURBAN INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT



On 1 May 2010, the new King Shaka International Airport becomes operational for all Durban-bound air travel. The current Durban International Airport will be decommissioned on midnight, 30 April 2010.

All flights into Durban up to and including Friday 30 April 2010 will operate from the current airport. From 1 May 2010, all flights will officially operate out of the new airport which is located approximately 35 kilometers north of the Durban city centre. Customers travelling into Durban before 30 April and out of Durban after 1 May should be reminded of the location change.

There is no change to the reservation process so please continue with Europcar reservations as normal.

King Shaka Airport is approximately 55km from the old Durban International Airport and the drive, without traffic, should be in the region of 40 minutes. Please ensure that you have allowed for extra travel time to get to and from the new airport. GPS units are available by prior reservation and are recommended for customers that are unfamiliar with the Durban area.
